Chichen Itza was developed by the Maya around 500 A.D. to pursue a quest for religious and scientific understanding. The ancient structures were constructed to study the heavens and to communicate with the gods. The city once was home to more than 60,000 residents and travelers on pilgrimages. The structures represent over 1000 years of construction from the Maya and the Toltec cultures. Visitors today come to marvel at the incredible work of the Maya and to rediscover their beliefs about the meaning of life.
