If you want to get deep about it, spiritual, once again you would say a different form which would be...... Te amo. And, you know, we almost don't even have to say 'Te amo mucho' because 'Te amo' is almost like you're already up there, so why add to something that's already so intense. Now, if you were to ask someone if they love you, in the familiar, you would say...... ¿Me Quieres? Do you love me, or not? ¿Me quieres, o no?
