BILLY KELLY held to his task well, was under restraint in the early running and finished gamely. UNDER FIRE gained steadily from a slow beginning and finished fast and gamely. VULCANITE ran well and finished close up. ETERNAL was done after going three-quarters. REGALO ran disappointingly. SENNINGS PARK tired in the stretch.

ETERNAL was a forward contender from the start, met with no mishaps and ran a game race. SWEEP ON was always prominent in the running, but was tiring at the end. DUNBOYNE began sideways in behind the other horses and had no chance. KING PLAUDIT ran a good race. OVER THERE made a fast finish. ROUTLEDGE and VULCANITE ran well.

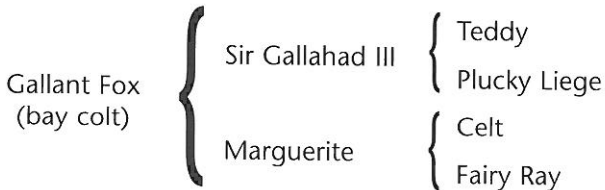

GALLANT FOX, in trouble on the first turn, went to the outside in the back stretch, caught the others with fine speed and, given a breathing spell when in contention, responded gamely to wear down CRACK BRIGADE and, ridden out, was drawing away at the end. CRACK BRIGADE forced a good pace and raced TETRARCHAL into submission and held on gamely after taking the lead. SNOWFLAKE, shuffled back at the half-mile post, recovered and finished gamely. MICHIGAN BOY improved his position slowly, but could not menace the leaders. GOLD BROOK offered a strong challenge on the turn, but tired at the end. SWEET SENTIMENT could not keep up. WOODCRAFT began slowly and was never a factor. TETRARCHAL showed fine speed for seven-eighths and quit badly.

GALLANT FOX, in extremely close quarters for the first three-eighths, raced into the lead on the outside after straightening out in the back stretch, held command under restraint thereafter and won with something in reserve. GALLANT KNIGHT began slowly, worked his way up with a big loss of ground, offered a mild challenge entering the final eighth, but tired badly near the end. NED O. began improving his position after five-eighths, lost ground on the last turn, but finished resolutely. GONE AWAY, on the extreme outside throughout, moved up fast on the stretch turn, but quit in the final eighth. CRACK BRIGADE, sent up with a rush after five-eighths, loomed up menacingly on the stretch turn, then quit. LONGUS came from far back in the stretch. TANNERY tired badly after racing prominently for seven-eighths. HIGH FOOT and ALCIBIADES tired. KILKERRY pulled up sore. BUCKEYE POET had early speed.

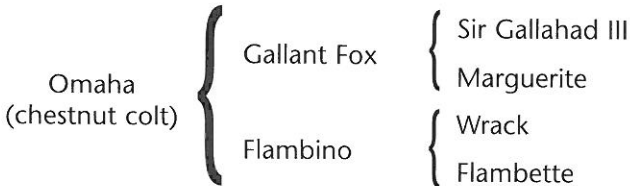

SWINFELD made a determined effort when called upon, but quit badly and was cased up at the end.

Start good and slow. Won easily; second and third driving.

OMAHA, much the best but lucky to escape interference in the early crowding, was taken to the outside after the first quarter, raced to the lead gradually after reaching the half-mile post and, upon taking command, held sway easily thereafter, winning with something left. ROMAN SOLDIER also enjoyed room in the early stages, worked his way to the outside after reaching the back stretch, responded well when called upon and stood severe pressure gamely in the final quarter, but could not menace the winner. WHISKOLO raced to a contending position with a rush, lost ground on the far turn and tired in the last three-sixteenths, but held the others safe. NELLIE FLAG suffered sharp interference from PLAT EYE soon after the start, was again impeded on the first turn, lacked room throughout the back stretch run and could not improve her position when clear in the last five-sixteenths. BLACKBIRDER came from far back and finished boldly. PSYCHIC BID raced well. MORPLUCK also showed good form. PLAT EYE caused much interference soon after the start, had speed, but quit badly after a mile. MCCARTHY made up ground. COMMONWEALTH was never prominent, failing to respond to pressure. TODAY was in close quarters on the back stretch, but failed to respond when clear and tired in the stretch. BOXTHORN quit badly. ST. BERNARD was cut off after reaching the back stretch.

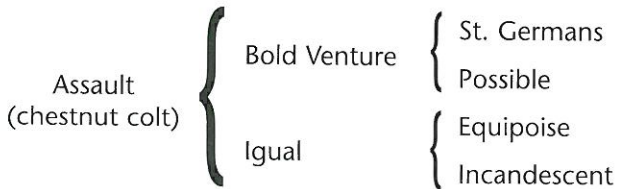

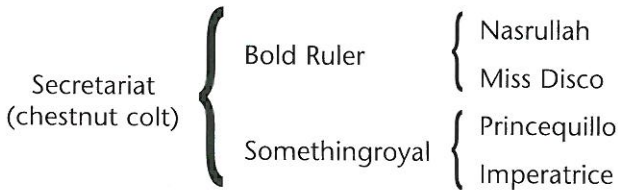

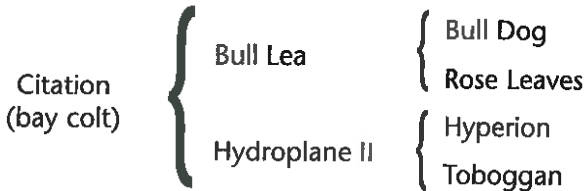

He responded readily when challenged by ALYDAR soon after entering the backstretch, held a narrow advantage into the stretch while continuing to save ground and was under left-handed urging to prevail in a determined effort. ALYDAR, away in good order, saved ground to the first turn. He came out to go after AFFIRMED with seven furlongs remaining, raced with that rival to the stretch, reached almost even terms with AFFIRMED near the three-sixteenths pole but wasn't good enough in a stiff drive. DARBY CREEK ROAD, unhurried while being outrun early, moved around horses while rallying on the far turn but lacked a further response. JUDGE ADVOCATE broke through before the start and was finished at the far turn. NOON TIME SPENDER raced within striking distance for a mile and gave way.

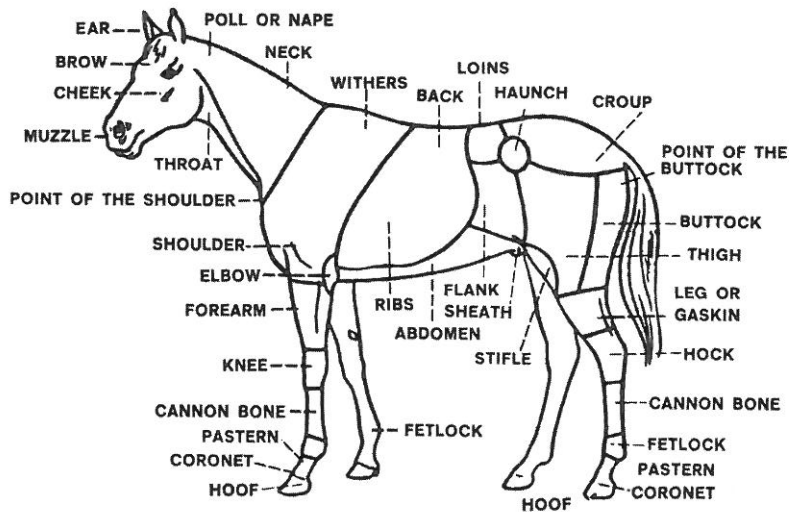
