


Spirochaetaceae is the family of bacteria to which the spirochete *Borrelia* belongs. This phylogeny is still being explored and this diverse and pathologically dangerous group of organisms will undoubtedly grow as more discoveries come to the fore. They continue to corkscrew themselves into our bodies and under the radar of modern medicine despite the millions upon millions infected. The nameless *Borrelia* in the relapsing fever group is the organism Dr. Shah (IGeneX Labs) and I discovered in 2015. If it were up to me I would like to call it *B shahnii*.


This is an example of a Western blot test for *Borrelia* in the relapsing fever (RF) group. The organisms in the RF group will not test positive using the criteria for the *brugdorferii* group with or without band 31 and 34 (which is shown) included in the band count.

STATES WITH HIGHEST RATE OF SCHIZOPHRENIA




Dicofol
