WELCOME TO SPANISH FOR EDUCATORS

You do not need to devote years of study to become fluent in another language. Spanish for Educators empowers you to learn only the language you need to know for your profession. The basic idea is that in order to improve communication with your Spanish-speaking students and their parents, all you need to know is the vocabulary that is essential to daily interactions. Spanish for Educators teaches you words and phrases that you can use immediately. The emphasis is on communication.

- ◆ You can listen to the CD while driving, exercising or relaxing at home. The important thing is that you listen to the CD many times. The more you listen, the more you will remember.
- ◆ You will hear each English word or phrase followed by a pause, then a Spanish translation by a native Spanish-speaker followed by a pause, and then the Spanish translation a second time by a non-native speaker, followed by another pause.

1. You will first be able to recite the word or phrase in the pause after the non-native speaker.

2. As you learn and progress, you will be able to recite the Spanish translation in the pauses after the native speaker and the non-native speaker.

3. Then finally, you will find that you are able to recall and recite the Spanish translation and say it in the pause immediately after the English word or phrase. At this point, you have internalized the new language!

- ◆ This listening guide includes every word and phrase from the CD with its phonetic pronunciation. You may want to follow along with the guide as you listen to the CD. You may also choose to use this guide as a quick reference to use at work.

¡OJO! Important Notes

- The upside down exclamation point (¡) and the question mark (¿) are used at the beginning of a sentence when writing in Spanish.
- Use the **—o** ending when describing a man, the **—a** ending when describing a woman.
