guide us to the perfect light.

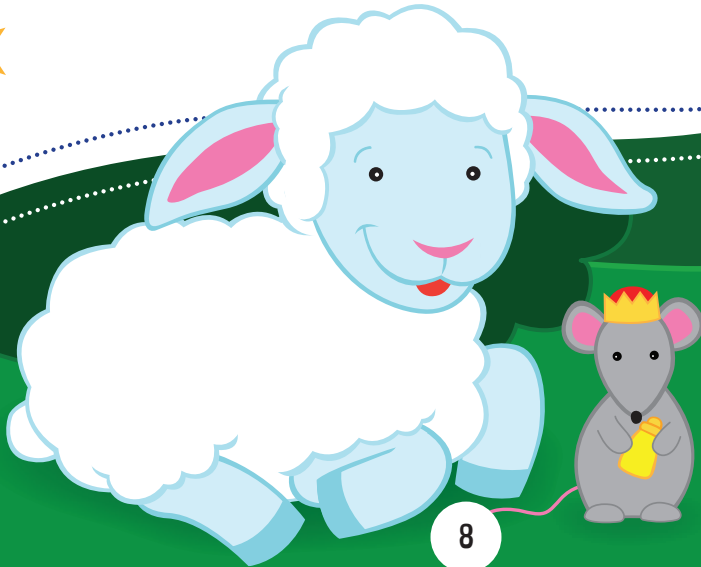


