




Who created the little bird that sits up in the tree?

He made everything with care and love.









It rained for 40 days and 40 nights. Water covered the earth. Noah, his family, and all the animals were safe inside the ark.






Noah and his family thanked God when they left the ark. The animals found new homes. God promised never to flood the earth again. He placed a rainbow in the sky to show his promise.




Jesse was an old man with eight sons. David was his youngest. David was a shepherd boy who liked to play his harp and look after his father's sheep. David also loved God and was very brave.




One day while his older brothers were out in battle, David took them some food and water. Jesse knew his older sons would be hungry. And he wanted to find out how the battle was going.







Jonah knew that the storm was his fault because he did not obey the Lord's command.



Daniel and wanted to put him in charge of his entire kingdom.






The shepherds went to Bethlehem. They found Jesus lying in a manger. They praised God for sending His only Son to earth. Jesus was God's greatest gift to us all!




Three days later, Jesus was alive again. God loves us so much that he sent His only Son to earth to die for our sins. God's gift is free to all who believe.




