

Figure 1.1: The Structure of a Worldview —Sorted by Importance










Figure 1.2: The Structure of a Worldview
—Sorted by Certainty










Figure 1.3: How a Worldview Mediates Experience












Figure 2.1: Anselm's Proof for God's Existence










Figure 2.3: Misplaced Metaphysical Dualism










Figure 4.1: The Threefold Image of God










Figure 10.1: Sin's Swath of Destruction










Figure 10.2: How the Fall Damages Our Image of God

Figure 11.1: The Recapitulation of Redemption










Figure 11.2: How Redemption Repairs Our Image of God
